ALICE

ALICE is a protocol used by EPSD9 duringan event of an armed intruder into one of our buildings..

A = Alert, inform people of the threat giving as much information as possible.

L = Lockdown, students and staff lockdown and barricade their area if it is not safe to exit.

I = Inform, continue to pass along information to others, including 911.

C = Counter, as an effort of last resort students and teachers are being trained to use every effort to stop the intruder instead of becoming a passive victim. **E = Evacuate**, if it is safe to

ALICE is not a checklist; it offers options for students and staff to stay safe in the unlikely event of an armed intruder.

Although defending oneself carries some risk, being passive has proven ineffective in most active shooter



STANDARD REUNIFICATION METHOD

Circumstances may occur at the school that requires parents to pick up their students in a formalized, controlled Release. This process is called a Reunification and may be necessary due to weather, a power outage, hazmat or if a crisis occurs at the school. The Standard Reunification Method is a protocol that makes this process morepredictable and less chaotic for all involved.

Because a reunification is not a typical end-of-school day event, a reunification may occur at a different location than the school a student attends. If this location is another school, then those students may be subject to a controlled release

EMERGENCY PROTOCOL FOR EVACUATIONS/REUNIFICATIONS

In most cases, the evacuation of a school building is a temporary matter. Evacuations most often occur due to a fire drill or a malfunctioning alarm. In these cases, all students and building personnel exit their building and congregate in designated areas until the fire department authorizes re-entry.

In the event of an emergency or disaster occurring in our area, EPSD9, along with law enforcement officials, have developed a plan to reunite students with their families which will be readily available via local news stations, ParentVUE & EPSD9 app and EPSD9 Facebook Page.

If an emergency or disaster situation occurs while school is in session, please help us care for all students:

Please remain calm.

DO NOT GO TO THE SCHOOL—it is important to keep home and school lines open. EPSD9 & ParentVUE App / Websites /Mass Messaging System automatic phone & text system will deliver important information.

Listen to local TV stations for up to the minute information.

PLEASE WATCH for notifications and directions on how to reunite with your child.
